- a flexible and collaborative approach to working with others;
- the capacity to make fair and objective decisions;
- the ability to professionally deal with sensitive and confidential information;
- high ethical standards and integrity.

The Board is currently looking for new members who are passionate about advancing the work of ACALA, and who also bring experience in one or more of the following areas:

- Active engagement in the local business community;
- Risk management;
- Strategic thinking & planning, from a governance perspective;
- Social media, marketing, and/or promotion;

Election of new board members will occur at the ACALA AGM on **June 26, 2019**, and terms will start in September 2019.
